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CHAIRMAN FILLAUER: I'd like to call to order the Oak Ridge Board of Education special-called meeting Monday, April 15, 2013. We have one item on the agenda and this is an Item for Action. It will be the approval of the contract for Dr. Bruce Borchers to become Superintendent of the Oak Ridge Schools.

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Before we get to that, let me take just a couple of minutes, this has certainly been an interesting adventure for this Board, which began back in April, I believe, as we went through this process. I think I can safely speak for all my colleagues on the Board that it has been a learning experience. Four of us had never done this before in this capacity. Ms. Richter was the only one who had any experience. We were ably guided by our search team Ray & Associates and we are appreciative of their efforts and their interest in the Oak Ridge Schools.

More importantly, a particularly large, large thank you first to Dr. Smallridge's secretary, Lynne Lammerhirt, who helped a lot with the paperwork and the timing and making sure that everything was in the right place as it should be.

copy would be mailed back to him and, as they say, we would be ready to move on and we are in business.

Mr. Eby, I'm going to turn it over to you and direct us as you see fit.

MR, EBY: Okay, Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And I too do appreciate the support from Dr. Lee and Larry Glordano. It's very helpful for me to just go through the response and we did get. it's in the original contract to Dr. Borchers' and he had replied and sent some requests back, which I don't think any of the requests that he sent back would be unreasonable of any CEO from a fifty million dollar a year business. So we looked at all the requests and we took into account our staff and our school system and the conditions that we are in and went through each one of those requests and came up with a revised contract and I'll just kind of highlight what we ended up changing in the original contract.

The first thing is he asked if we would start the contract on the 18th of June instead of the 15th of June. He had some family vacation aiready scheduled for that. And I didn't

So this Board thanks her tremendously. And certainly we couldn't be where we are tonight without the help of Dr. Chris Lee and our school board attorney, Larry Giordano, and we graciously thank both of you for your time and efforts. A lot of this took place over hours...I guess lawyers are always on call, are they not, Larry, pretty much? MR. GIORDANO: Yes, sir.

CHAIRMAN FILLAUER: But overtime where you would not normally be on call, so to speak, and we greatly appreciate that. Dr. Lee and Larry, thank you both very much for your support

and your effort on this. Last but not least, a large thanks to Mr. Eby who took it upon himself to direct with the help of the aforementioned individuals, to direct this negotiation with Dr. Borchers. And, Bob, appreciate that tremendously. We have two signed contracts in hand from Dr. Borchers so tonight's meeting will be to answer any questions you might have or any comments you would like to make. At that point in time we would need a motion to approve the contract with Dr. Borchers. If that contract is approved then it would be signed and a

think that would be an issue so we agreed to that.

He also asked or requested that if we did not take any action on the contract by the 15th of December each year that it would be automatically extended. In talking with our attorney the state law does not accept that. In fact, the extension of the contract requires a called Board meeting with public announcement and formal action taken. Also recognized his interest in wanting to know kind of how the Board feels about him in the future and in the last several years we have always extended the contracts kind of In the December-January time period. So what we did is we put in the contract and said; on or before December 15th of each year during the term of the contract the Board shall meet to discuss and consider possible extension of the contract. So that does not require us to take any action, it does not commit us to an extension of the contract but I think it is only fair that as part of our evaluation process we have to evaluate every year

and we talk about our feelings and what our intent

would be. But we are not required to take action.

He accepted that as a change.

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He had asked for an annual compensation for a slight increase over \$175,000. I had increased it to \$178,000 at the request. He had asked to go to \$182,000 but I increased it to \$178,000 to cover other things that we will talk about later. So there is a change in the base salary from \$175,000 to \$178,000. And I actually went online and looked up annual superintendents' salaries, typical superintendent salaries in this region and across the country. And as we go into common core standards I think we want to be competitive across the country but we also need to be cognizant of cost of living here in the south. And I think \$178,000 compensation is very consistent with those numbers so I increased that by \$3,000.

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One of the other things that he had requested was a life insurance policy of \$250,000. The life insurance policy we offered was \$50,000. It turns out I think this is the life insurance policy we offered Dr. Smallridge when he started here I don't know how many years ago. And I know that most companies certainly provide life insurance at least one times the salary and usually

it does not interfere with any performance of director of school's duties and responsibilities as described in the paragraph. We do recognize, though, that some of those meetings could happen during the school year.

And the last thing he asked is there was the very last clause with unilateral transfer. The Board shall have the option, well, that's not the last thing he asked for, the last thing we agreed to. The Board shall have the option to transfer the superintendent to any other position in the school system for the term of the contract. And for some reason, I don't believe this would happen but, if for some reason this contract did not work out, my feeling is we would not want him in the school system anyway so I have agreed and recommend that we pull that contract.

There were some other requests that he made I didn't go over, if you have questions about it, but these were the requests that he made and working with Larry we worked into the contract and this is what I bring forward and recommend for approval to the Board of Education.

CHAIRMAN FILLAUER: You have heard

7 higher than that. So having a family of four, I certainly understand the importance of life insurance. I worked with Dr. Lee, I think the cost of that is like \$600 a year, or something like that. He asked for proof of insurance insurability. What we are going to do is we are going to give him the \$50,000 policy that was standard and then a supplemental policy of \$200,000 through the same company pending its approval of insurability.

We had offered a telephone, cell service for him. He indicated a desire to decline that but I want to leave in the contract that we were offering that service to him in case in the future he decides he wants to take it then we don't have to re-establish the contract. I suspect, I don't know, but I suspect one reason is because it becomes the property of the school system and this is just a cleaner way to do it. So we may even put it as an option for him.

He requested that he be able to maintain his current involvement in the ERDI and we certainly support continued professional activities so we did say that we would support that provided

1 the recommendation and I will accept that, since 2 you were the committee of one, as a motion.

MR. EBY: Yes.

CHAIRMAN FILLAUER: And I would
