### **Course Overview**

In this one term (9 week) course, students will study the purposes, principles, and practices of American government as established by the Constitution. Students are expected to understand their rights and responsibilities as citizens and how to exercise these rights and responsibilities in local, state, and national government. Students will learn the structure and processes of the government of the state of Tennessee and various local governments. The reading of primary source documents is a key feature of United States Government and Civics standards.

Failure to complete assignments will lead to failing the class, which in turn would prevent graduation as American Government is a required course for a high school diploma in Tennessee.
