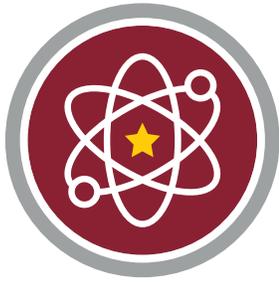

## SIZE AND SPACE REQUIREMENTS

In order to ensure the appropriate visibility, prominence and strength of the ORS logo, an area of isolation and a minimum size have been determined. These guidelines apply to both print and digital usage.

### AREA OF ISOLATION

A minimum space requirement around the logo is required to ensure prominence of the mark and to prevent interference from other elements in a design. This space is indicated by X in the figure to the right. X is equal to the height shown.

### MINIMUM ISOLATION

The ORS logo and all other design elements, including: images, typography, photos, graphics, rules, and the substrate or page edge.

### PREFERRED ISOLATION

The area of isolation is a minimum space recommendation. Increase the area of isolation whenever possible.



### MINIMUM SIZE REQUIREMENTS

To maintain recognizability, the Oak Ridge Schools logo must not be made smaller than 1.5" wide by .44" high. This is the minimum size and should be used larger in every possible instance.

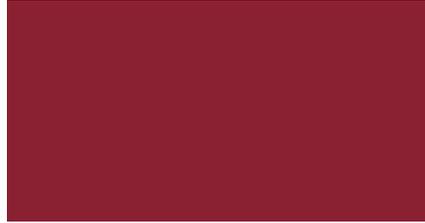

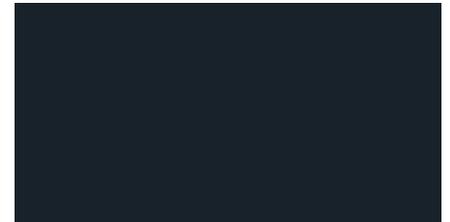

## DISTRICT LOGO FONTS

Consistent use of brand typography helps establish a unique Oak Ridge Schools “look” that greatly increases recognizability and memorability of the brand. Two fonts have been selected for the Oak Ridge Schools brand: Poynter Oldstyle Display and Sweet Sans Pro. Poynter Oldstyle Display is used for the school name while Sweet Sans Pro is used for school level and departmental and club names.

## LETTERHEAD AND BUSINESS CARDS

In order to maintain the brand standard, it is crucial that brand fonts, colors, and other elements be used consistently across all printed correspondence. A letterhead template has been developed that sets the formatting style for margins, fonts, colors, line spacing, and other brand elements that should be used when developing a printed document. An example of this template and the business card template is pictured here. These templates should be used for all correspondence intended to be printed on the Oak Ridge Schools branded letterhead and business cards. Arial is to be used in the body copy of the letterhead. This is to ensure consistency as everyone has access to this font.

## OAK RIDGE SCHOOL LOGOS

## LOGO SPACING

### AREA OF ISOLATION

A minimum space requirement around the logo is required to ensure prominence of the mark and to prevent interference from other elements in a design. This space is indicated by X in the figure to the right. X is equal to the height shown.

### MINIMUM ISOLATION

The ORS logo and all other design elements, including: images, typography, photos, graphics, rules, and the substrate or page edge.

### PREFERRED ISOLATION

The area of isolation is a minimum space recommendation. Increase the area of isolation whenever possible.

### MINIMUM SIZE REQUIREMENTS

To maintain recognizability, the Oak Ridge school logos must not be made smaller than 1.4” wide by .44” high. This is the minimum size and should be used larger in every possible instance.



## LOGO COLOR VARIATIONS

Because not all display mediums and modes of reproduction have the same color requirements, multiple color options have been developed for the Oak Ridge school logos. It is important to use the correct logo for the given situation so as to remain consistent with the overall brand. For example, when placing the logo on the web, make sure to use the digital version of the logo.

### FULL COLOR

This is the primary color combination that should be used on all communication materials whenever possible. When used on a black background the full color logo should include the letters in white. It is not acceptable in the brand to substitute white for another color or add it to another variation of the logo.

### OTHER APPROVED LOGOS

Single color options are available for use when budget, application type, or material needs warrant their use.
