- In accordance with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, service dogs and trained 1
- miniature horses¹ (hereinafter referred to as service animals) are permitted for use by individuals with 2
- disabilities on district property and in district facilities provided the individuals and their animals meet 3
- the requirements and responsibilities covered in this policy. 4
- 5 When an individual with a disability seeks to bring a service animal into a district facility, the district
- is entitled to ask the individual if the animal is required because of a disability and what work or task 6
- the animal has been trained to perform.² The district is not entitled to ask for documentation that the 7
- animal has been properly trained, but the individual bringing the animal into a district facility will be 8
- held accountable for the animal's behavior. 9
- Any service animal brought into a district facility by an individual with a disability must have been 10
- trained to do work or perform tasks for the individual. The work or tasks performed by the service 11
- 12 animal must be directly related to the handler's disability. Examples of work or tasks include, but are
- not limited to, assisting individuals who are blind or have low vision with navigation and other tasks, 13
- alerting individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, providing 14
- non-violent protection, pulling a wheelchair, assisting an individual during a seizure, alerting 15
- individuals to the presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine, providing physical support 16
- and assistance with balance and stability to individuals with mobility disabilities, and helping persons
- 17
- with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting impulsive or destructive 18
- 19 behaviors.
- 20 The crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence and the provision of emotional support, well-being,
- comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks for the purposes of this policy. 21
- 22 Individuals with disabilities shall be permitted to be accompanied by their service animals in all areas
- 23 of a public entity's facilities where members of the public, participants in services, programs or
- activities, or invitees, as relevant, are allowed to go. 24
- 25 A service animal shall be under the control of its handler. A service animal shall have a harness, leash,
- or other tether, unless either the handler is unable because of a disability to use a harness, leash, or 26
- 27 other tether, or the use of a harness, leash, or other tether would interfere with the service animal's
- safe, effective performance of work or tasks, in which case the service animal must be otherwise under 28
- the handler's control by means of voice control, signals, or other effective means. 29
- District staff may ask an individual with a disability to remove a service animal from the premises if: 30
- (1) The animal is out of control and the animal's handler does not take effective action to control it; or 31

- 1 (2) The animal is not housebroken.
- 2 (3) The animal's presence would fundamentally alter the nature of the service, program or activity.³
- 3 If the district excludes a service animal due to the reasons listed above, the district shall give the
- 4 individual with a disability the opportunity to participate in the service, program, or activity without
- 5 having the service animal on the premises.
- 6 The District and its staff are not responsible for the care or supervision of a service animal brought
- 7 onto district property or into district facilities by an individual with a disability.
- 8 The District shall not ask or require an individual with a disability to pay a surcharge, even if people
- 9 accompanied by pets are required to pay fees, or to comply with other requirements generally not
- applicable to people without pets.
